

JENNY GILLAM AND EUGENE HANSEN: THE THRUM OF THE TIDE

The thrum of the tide by Jenny Gillam and Eugene Hansen (Maniapoto) is about the early 20th century story of Te Ana Ru, a sea cave known as 'the ballroom cave'. It has been said that early settlers held Saturday night dances in the cave until the 1920s on a repurposed kauri floor installed by local timber mill workers. It would be hoisted to the ceiling of the cave to protect it from high tides. The dances are a well-known folklore in Huia and Whatipū and it is thought the floor might still be in the cave, buried deep under sand.

A re-creation of the moveable floor will be presented in the gallery, accompanied by a soundscape of subterranean seismic vibrations and taonga pūoro by Riki Bennett (Ngāti Pikiao, Ngāti Whakaue, Te Arawa, Ngāti Porou) captured in Te Ana Ru during the artists' tenure on the Auckland Regional Parks Artist Residency in 2019.

SHANNON TE AO: KA MUA, KA MURI

Ka mua, ka muri explores experiences of time, history and song. The exhibition's title, *Ka mua, ka muri*, is derived from a whakatauki often cited as a central guiding principle within Māori ideology. Meaning "to walk backwards into the future," it suggests time exists on a continuum where past, present and future co-exist and are inherently tethered through ancestry and action. Central to this is an understanding of the critical importance of language as a vital means to maintain links to indigenous knowledge systems, culture, and identity, a theme that recurs throughout Te Ao's practice.

Showing for the first time in Aotearoa, the exhibition was originally co-commissioned by two major Canadian galleries, Oakville Galleries, Toronto and Remai Modern, Saskatoon, with the support of Creative New Zealand. For this homecoming exhibition, Te Ao has added new works from his recent 2020 exhibition *Mā te wā*, as well as a new text work in collaboration with Kurt Komene (Te Ātiawa, Taranaki Whanui).

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

TERM TWO WORKSHOPS

PRIMARY AND INTERMEDIATE

This term we are offering three different types of workshop delivery to choose from. You can either visit Te Uru and go for a gallery tour with a hands-on workshop, or we can visit you with our Art in a Box lessons, or try our new Art in a Bag workshops. Art in a Bag gives you a comprehensive lesson plan with everything you need to facilitate an interactive workshop in your classroom.

Wonders of contemporary jewellery

Inspired by a gallery tour of Lisa Walker's incredible exhibition of experimental jewellery, for this class we will design and create a unique mixed media pendant. (Yrs. 2–8, social history, technology and visual art strands DI, CI, PK, UC)

Matariki options

We will explore Te Ao Māori with two class options to choose from: make and paint an unfired clay taniwha, or design and paint a vibrant collaborative mural depicting the Manukau harbour and taniwha. (Yrs. 1–8, social history, te reo Māori, identity and visual art strands DI, CI, PK, UC)

Matariki Art in a Bag option: kākahu/cloak

Create a special classroom kākahu and learn about the history and significance of traditional Māori cloaks. Students design a unique set of stylised symbols to place inside triangular feather shapes that relate to their own identity. The workshop will combine mixed media techniques as well as a collaborative element to decorate the edges of the cloak. We can send this out to your school with everything you need for this lesson plan. (Yrs. 1–8, te reo Māori, social history, technology, and visual art strands DI, CI, PK, UC)

Te Uru Winter guided tour for high schools and tertiary students

Te Uru presents *Wayward works*, an exciting selection of originals and work in print by local illustrator Anna Crichton. Over many years, award-winning satirical illustrator Anna Crichton has enhanced both New Zealand and overseas publications with her sharply drawn cartoons, caricatures and illustrations. Using dip pen, ink and a brush, Crichton illustrates social commentary with a satirical edge. Her work is abstract and humorous, replete with pictorial puns and metaphors that draw the reader into the article they accompany. For Crichton, there is a process to responding to an article, whether in the business, politics, food or book review pages of a publication. Visitors to this exhibition will have the opportunity to learn about this process, and be entertained and enthralled by some of Crichton's most memorable published works.
